FROM THE PRESIDENT

Greetings, Lutheran Ladies!

I truly enjoy being with you at your retreats. Some of you know how to have a really fun time! And many of the retreats had some very good speakers. Meanwhile, back to the Plaza and the convention topic. It seems likely that we will be able to have our convention at a church close to Highway 53. I have yet to hear back from the “powers that be” at that location, but when I do, you will be the first people to know! Meanwhile, anyone who likes to organize and plan is welcome to contact me about helping with the next convention. I'll actually start begging later.

And the applause can start now!! Mary Jane Sedin and I finally got our act together enough to plan a gathering for the Lake Superior Conference women. It will be a 9:30 am Saturday morning brunch at Peace Lutheran Church in Poplar, right on Highway 2 that goes across from Superior to Ashland. None of us can remember how many years it has been since Lake Superior has gathered, so we are hoping many will be curious enough to check us out. We will be attending the national gathering for “Cherish All Children” which is an ELCA ministry based in Minneapolis led by Rev. Amy Hartman. Amy has also been involved with the Lutheran Office for Public Policy in Wisconsin when they have put on the workshops against sexual trafficking. Therefore, though we are fearful and full of doubt, we trust in God; and in the name of Jesus Christ, we commit ourselves in the service of others, to seek justice and to live in peace; to care for the earth and to share the goodness of God's creation; to live in the freedom of forgiveness and the power of the Spirit; and in the company of the faithful to be the church to the glory of God.

The phrase about seeking justice and living in peace brings me to my last point: Scripture asks us to pray for political and government leaders. Regardless of your political persuasion, prayer for our election seems like the best option. My challenge to you is that every time you are agonizing over a political ad or news item, say a quick prayer that God's will be done. And then make sure you vote!

Discipleship

Have you ever thought what discipleship means as a woman of the ELCA? Webster's dictionary defines discipleship as, "a follower of Jesus Christ". As women of the ELCA there are many ways to be his disciples. According to the Women of the ELCA website there are **seven ways that we can practice discipleship: praying, studying, worshiping, inviting, serving and giving.**

In many of the leadership training sessions I have participated in with our conference, one of the questions that always arises is how can we get more women to participate. We understand that many of our women are busy with families, full-time jobs, being a caretaker of a loved one, dealing with



illness, children active in sports and other family commitments making it hard to add one more thing to a sometimes busy schedule. In

looking at these seven practices maybe we need to redefine how we look at our women's group. One thing I think we forget is that all women are members of Women of the ELCA whether they are associated with an "active group" or not. Even though they may not be active in your women's group they may be active in other ways.

Encourage and uplift all women in your congregation through your prayers. Maybe you may wish to connect with those who may not be a current participant and select them as a prayer partner for a year to help support them in their daily walk.

Encourage all to study Christ's word daily, not only in your monthly group Bible studies by inviting them but also in your own personal daily life. In our electronic age with computers and smartphones we have access to many wonderful daily devotions and Bible study materials. Encourage all to worship. Here many of our young women are willing to help teach Sunday or


Vacation Bible School or be worship assistants and serve on council, thank them for their willingness to participate in these areas. Invite them to participate in your quilting sessions, or encourage families to help put together a health, school or layette kit as a family. Encourage those who may knit or crochet to participate in your prayer shawl ministry. Many are willing to provide food for an event. Choose a special women's offering throughout the year that all may participate by giving to.

THE SERMON YOU PREACH

The first sermon preached each Sunday is not preached by the pastor but by YOU.

YOU preach a message of good cheer when you say "Good Morning!" to those you meet when you park your car and when you are near the foyer.



YOU preach a message of "Welcome! We have room for you", when you slide down the pew instead of forcing others to squeeze in front of you.



YOU preach a message of hope and joy when you sing enthusiastically during the hymns and songs in the worship service.

YOU preach a message of the power of prayer when you fervently enter into our time of prayer together.

YOU preach a message of respect for God and His Word when you listen attentively and follow the readings either in the bulletin or in your Bible, and take notes while your pastor is preaching.

YOU preach a message of seriousness and sincerity as you remain in the Sanctuary, participating in every part of the worship service.



YOU preach a message of hope when you reverently partake of the Lord's Supper.

YOU preach a message about faith when you cheerfully give your offering.



YOU preach a message of love when you smile, say 'Hello', introduce yourself to the guests/visitors at the worship service and invite them to join you for church activities.

Many messages are preached *before* and *after* your pastor has stood in the pulpit. If your message is positive and consistent, then the message given by your pastor will much better received.

Stewardship

"Every man shall give as he is able, according to the blessing of the LORD your God which He has given you. Deuteronomy 16:17



Two weeks ago I celebrated, I think I celebrated, a pretty significant milestone in my life. It was my 70th birthday and as the commercial for Medicare says on TV " where has the time gone", I found myself asking that same question. When I was a child 70 seemed to me to be really old, but now I have a different opinion. There has also been one fear that has also haunted me since childhood and that is that I fear time will run out on me. I have feared that I would leave this earth not having accomplished all I wanted to do and all that I should do.

I decided that it might be a good idea to sit down and take some time on this special day to look at my stewardship scale and see if it is in balance. I know as I look back at my life that God has blessed me and my family richly. The question, however, have I done the best I could have with His gifts of time, talent, and money that he has entrusted to me? I want to think that for the most part I have, but I also know that there is probably room for improvement. Is my scale heavier on the side of gifts received or is it heavier on the side of gifts used and given?



Each of us has our own stewardship scale. We need to be stepping back from time to time, certainly not waiting till our 70th birthday, and see how balanced we are. Are we giving of our time to others, or are we selfish and using our time to do things that give only us pleasure and happiness? Are we keeping our God given talents under cover for fear that someone will see them and ask us to use them for the good of our neighbor? Have we been generous with our monies and has tithing been a part of our vocabulary.

Take a moment to check and see if your stewardship scale reflects your giving as you have been blessed.

The Scholarship Selection Committee (the Administrative Committee of the SWO), will review the applications for all scholarships, keeping the criteria below in mind as well as considering ages, ethnic background, and mother/daughter applicants:

EXPECTATIONS:

- 1) An attitude of wanting to make a difference because of attendance at this event.
- 2) A willingness to share your experience either in written form and/or verbally in our Northwest Synod.

RESTRICTIONS:

- 1) No more than two (2) yearly events in succession.
- 2) One Triennial Gathering every six (6) years.
- 3) A Synodical Board member may receive a scholarship for only one event during her term.
- 4) Inability to attend the event constitutes forfeiture of the scholarship.

*Immediately following the 2014 Triennial in Charlotte, your SWO Board purchased the 14 Triennial scholarship registrations for \$280 each, which is by far the cheapest price they will ever be. Because our Policies and Procedures official document allows us to contribute \$200 each for these scholarships, we are asking the recipients to reimburse us for the \$80 difference. Therefore, if you are selected we will be asking

you to provide our Treasurer with a check for the \$80. If you have questions about this, please contact your **SWO President, Sue Saarem 715-268-5586.**

TRIENNIAL UPDATE

Hi, everyone:

July 13-16, 2017 is getting closer. Here is what you should know.



REGISTRATION: Registration opens September 6, 2017. If you went to a previous Triennial, you got a registration booklet in the mail. If you didn't, not to worry: go to the Women of the ELCA website and you can print one off. You can register online, by fax or by mail. You can pay by credit card or check. On the registration form, under Synodical Women's Organization, put Northwestern Wisconsin. Our Region Number is 5 and our Synod Letter is H. Also on the registration form you can sign up for volunteer opportunities, optional tours and optional activities.

If you pre-registered at the Triennial in Charlotte, you will get a letter telling you how to proceed. If you are applying for a scholarship (and why not??), you will have to wait to register until you find out if you get a scholarship. (Look online or in this issue and prior issues of the "Northwester" for an application.) But the reduced registration fee is good through January 6, 2017, and scholarship applications are due November 1, 2016, so the Board will take care of that right away and let you know so you can register before the fees go up. You can also register just for a day. For girls 13 through 18, the early-bird fee is \$100. For a child under 13, the registration fee is free!

Delegates, your hotel and meals are taken care of during the convention, which takes place immediately before the Gathering. If you want to attend the Gathering (and believe me, you do!), you have register for this like anyone else and pay for it on your own (or with a scholarship; hint, hint!)

HOTELS: You must reserve a hotel room separately. And if you are staying for the full Gathering, you want to reserve a room for Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights, July 13, 14 and 15, 2017. You can buddy up with some friends and save some money. If you are sharing a room, only one of you has to make the reservation; just put everybody's name on the reservation request. Delegates, for the Gathering, you have to reserve and pay for your hotel rooms like the rest of us.

BUSES: We have tentatively reserved two coach buses to take us to the Triennial. They would both leave Thursday morning, pick women up and take us to Minneapolis. Then they would come back Sunday afternoon, pick us up and take us back. One route we are looking at would stop at Spooner, Rice Lake and St. Croix Falls. The other route would stop at Medford, Osseo and Eau Claire. We will check with leaving our cars at local churches. Depending on how many women we get to sign up for the bus we may have to make changes or cancel one bus and change the stops. I hope not; I hope we can get enough for two buses. And depending on how many women are on each bus depends on the price. We are hoping to keep the price at \$50.00 or less round trip. And the bus will have to be prepaid. I will be talking to the board about how we are going to handle collecting the money for the bus.

We are not going to run a bus just for Friday or Saturday; I know someone asked me about it but that will be too hard to fill, get too expensive, and too much extra work in dealing with that.

And please keep in mind the buses will not be staying there to take us to restaurants or to and from the hotels. That would get very expensive. So if your walking is a little on the iffy side, you may want to think about getting a cane or a walker or even a wheelchair to help you get around. On the registration form, you can indicate whether you need to rent a wheelchair or a scooter for inside the convention center, or also to arrange wheelchair-accessible shuttle service. If you indicate that on the registration form, they will forward you information on providers and pricing, so there is a fee for that.



CLOTHING WITH LOGO: Once again you can order clothing with the Triennial or W/ELCA logo from Lands' End. Do not go to the Lands' End website to do this: go to the Women of the ELCA website to order clothing with the logo.

FOOD: You have to buy your own food during the Gathering. There will probably be a food court in the convention center where you can buy things to eat. And I'm sure there are restaurants around the convention center and in the hotels.



SHOPPING: There will be opportunities for shopping at the Gathering also. There will be books, fair trade items, jewelry and other goodies. So you might want to plan for a little spending money there too.

FUNDRAISING: Who does most of the fundraising to pay for things at your church? Why, it's the women of course. So why not have a fundraiser to pay for your Triennial trip? Ask around and see if there are any women from your church who want to go to the Triennial and then put together a bake sale or rummage sale; anything to help defray costs.

The registration fee may seem like a lot of money, but for a national convention, it is not. They are paying for speakers, or microphones for the rooms, for musicians . . . uff da! The list can go on and on. A lot goes into putting on a Triennial. And our leadership at churchwide tries to get this all paid for without using any offerings sent in through the year, which is pretty amazing to me.

CONCLUSION: The Triennial will never get any closer than this so it's the perfect time to go. You will never, never regret going to a Triennial. Please let me know when you register and if you are interested in taking the bus and where you would like to get on the bus.

Treasurer



Fall seems to be a start of a new year when our summer schedule changes into a fall routine. Many W/ELCA groups are back to meeting regularly. Our Synod Women's Organization (SWO) relies on your W/ELCA group offerings for its ministries and operation. We appreciate the portion of your offerings you share with us.

Please use FORM A for your offerings from your units and any of our special synod offerings like Malawi Literacy Program. Use FORM B to send in your Thankofferings, Katie's Fund, or Quilt shipping fund for the churchwide W/ELCA office to their processing company address: W/ELCA PO BOX 1809, MERRIFIELD, VA 22116-8009. These forms can be found on the Women of the ELCA website under Stewardship.

I want to share with you how we spent \$10,146 from your unit offerings to our ministries through July: \$600 each to Luther Point and Luther Park Bible Camps, \$5,000 to Seminary Scholarships for Women, \$540 to Synod Convention Scholarships, and \$3,406 to W/ELCA churchwide. Your conference offerings also flow through the synod treasury to the churchwide W/ELCA and from the spring events amounted to \$2,045. We will soon give out Lay School Scholarships to 7 women. What a blessing you have been to many women.

Our total expenses for the convention was about \$10,200 and when registration income was only \$8,120, we were able to cover expenses with the help of the convention expense fund that units donated toward. Thank you so much for your faithfulness in sending that!

On the W/ELCA website, it was announced that a new Thankoffering service will be on their website by mid-September and in the fall issue of Interchange which will also include the Stewardship Guide. Go to our Northwest Synod SWO webpage at www.nws wis wo.org and find a link to Congregational Unit Treasurer's Offering Schedule in the right column for dates and places where offerings and gifts should be sent.



Our officers training workshop on September 21 will have a different format as each office information will be presented to the whole group. We hope that officer information will be better understood by the whole boards of the conferences and units that attend.
