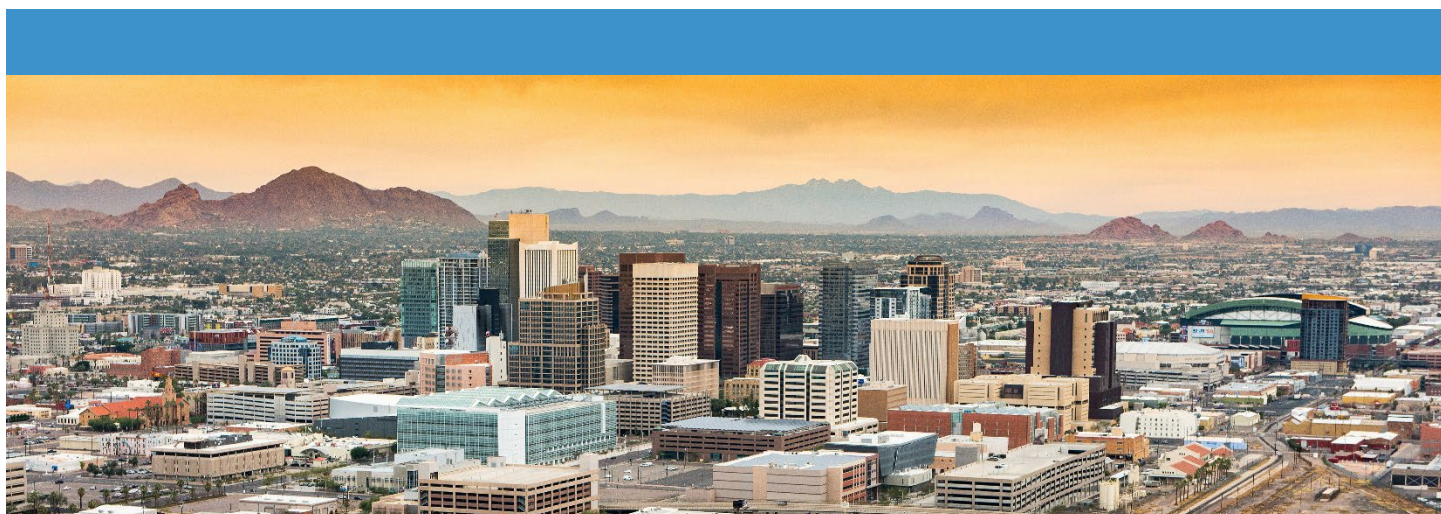

Growing Katie's Fund for the next 100 years

So what is Katie's Fund? In the beginning, Lutherans knew Katie Luther as the wife of Martin Luther. But over the years, through resources, scholarships, articles, and skits, Women of the ELCA told the story of this bold and brave woman who brewed beer, raised cattle, managed a busy household, and kept a theologian in line. These days, Katie Luther is loved and admired by those who have learned about her. Many women see a bit of themselves in this legend who wore many bonnets.

For 25 years, women have given to Katie's Fund to support and sustain the ministries of Women of the ELCA. And the organization hopes giving will last far into the future. That's why they created a new capital campaign, 2122: Growing Katie's Fund for the next 100 years with a goal to raise \$1 million. The funds are used to raise bold leaders for the women's organization.

Katie's Fund supports ministry in three areas:

- raises bold leaders for the women's organization;
- supports global connections with women throughout the world;
- and living theology - women living out their faith using their gifts and talents in many and varied ways in the women's organization, the community, the congregation, and the church.

In the past 25 years Katie's fund provided resources and information for youth at the national youth gatherings about Human Trafficking. Funds have also been used to bring youth and young women to Triennial Gatherings, to provide cultural experiences for Women of the ELCA to travel to other countries, and for women in other countries to come here. A constant goal is to raise up leaders for the women's organization.

Our synod women's organization received a \$1000 grant from Katie's Fund, and we designated \$500 for building a new well in Malawi so the women, instead of walking miles to get water each day, will have time to perhaps further their education or have time to nurture their own business that provides income for the family. With the remaining \$500 we provided scholarships for the summer retreat held at Luther Park Bible Camp and gave subscriptions to the Gather Magazine. May these recipients be inspired to share what they read, hear, and learn, and in doing so become bold leaders for the women's organization and live out their faith in new and varied ways.

I am also pleased to inform you the ministries your Synodical Women's Organization has supported this summer:

- \$2000 to the 2122 Campaign for growing Katie's Fund for the future
- \$500 to the Women of the ELCA Triennial Convention Offering
- \$500 to the Women of the ELCA Triennial Gather Offering
- \$1500 to Luther Park Bible Camp
- \$1500 to Luther Point Bible Camp
- We also closed our Mission Investment checking account and invested what was in it plus another \$2000 in a Mission Investment Fund which is giving us 4.764% interest. We are not only receiving more interest on our investment, but the Mission Investment Fund loans funds to congregations to help them expand their ministries.

I encourage your units to support the 2122 Campaign for growing Katie's Fund as well as sending offerings to the WELCA Triennial Convention and the WELCA Triennial Gathering - itemize on the blank lines on form B and send to the Virginia address.

We are all in mission together, serving Christ and sharing God's love to our neighbors near and far through our various ministries and projects. Together our offerings make a larger impact than what we individually could do.

I’m sure YOU remember the day our world seemed to shut down because of the Pandemic that we casually now refer to as Covid 19. For me, the date of March 17 is vivid in my memory. My church, Spirit Lutheran, was all set to kick off a building campaign that evening; but we were told we could not hold our church service. But my bigger memory is that it was St. Patrick’s Day. All across Eau Claire bars and restaurants were well stocked to serve Corn Beef and Cabbage. If you celebrated at noon, you were able to go into the establishment and enjoy a great meal. But suddenly, at 5 pm ALL doors were closed to social gatherings! FB and other social media platforms started blowing up because bars and restaurants were telling folks they could still enjoy their meal; simply call in your order and we will bring it to your car - similar to fast food places. It didn’t take long before all kinds of businesses created designated spaces for customers to pick up items they purchased. And many still use that service. They learned to adapt to a new reality.

Churches rallied also. We learned to use zoom and to stream our group activities, including church services and Bible studies. We purchased cute little plastic cups containing wine and a wafer for members to use at home, and we felt relief because we were able to share our faith with our friends and family, but sadly not in the same building.

Finally churches opened their doors, but church life was different. Some members chose to continue

taking part in the Sunday service in the comfort of their homes. Even now those who attend on Sunday miss their friends who do not join them. Slowly, churches are adapting to having fewer members inside our building.

How many times, since the Pandemic closed our church doors, and then we were able to open them to a new reality, have you heard: "I wonder what 'church' is going to look like in the future?"

This year, more than ever, I have noticed throughout the Chippewa Valley that we are asking our neighboring churches to work together on activities. Sometimes it's a fellow ELCA church, and sometimes it's a neighboring church of a different faith. The result? It's wonderful!! Rather than focusing on "my church" and its members, our friendships with friends (old and new) throughout our community is strengthened as we work side by side and share how we do similar traditions differently.

My hometown, Eau Claire, has eight ELCA churches. It's always been heartwarming to work together on projects during God's Work, our Hands. But now we are joining forces for other activities. Each summer our ELCA churches rent the city pool for an evening of water fun for families. Five churches gathered at Hope Lutheran in Eau Claire for VBS this summer, and University Lutheran is hosting a Bible Study on Wednesday evenings for all of us.

On October 29 from 1-4 pm our ELCA churches with choirs will gather at Trinity Lutheran. Each choir will sing a few songs of their choice, and for the grand finale all the choirs will sing together. It's truly a wonderful experience. At this same event, artists are invited to share their talents: painting, pottery or sculpture, rosemaling or folk painting, photography, jewelry, batik/fiber/fabric (no bigger than 3x5), and stained glass will all be on display.

Our ELCA churches with Praise Bands have also joined forces. Early this spring the churches with praise bands met to decide which band would play for each Sunday between June 4th and August 27th. When a church's praise band plays, their Pastor gives the message. Another Pastor signs up for the children's message, and a third Pastor is in charge of Communion. A google volunteer

document allows members from the various churches to volunteer when they were available throughout the summer. This event is called Praise in The Park and is held at Phoenix Park in Eau Claire. In case of rain, The Brewing Projekt has kindly volunteered to open its doors early so we can gather there. If you would like to see how it works, go to YouTube and enter in Praise in The Park, Eau Claire.

The idea of churches coming together is not limited to ELCA churches.

For over 25 years the EC faith community has supported what is now called Family Promise. A place for homeless families to find shelter and help, as they get back on their feet. Each week, two groups/churches pair up for the week to provide meals and other needs.

A few years ago, several faith communities joined forces to create the Inclusive Ministry Church that meets the third Sunday of each month at Lake Street Methodist Church from 3:00 - 4:30 pm. A message, God's love and a meal are shared with people in our community with cognitive and other disabilities.

As the ELCA was forming Green Teams in our churches, churches of various faiths in EC created a city wide Interfaith Green Team. Together they are learning how to help our members preserve the resources of our planet.

Working together with other churches is just ONE way we are helping our community members experience "church." Think about the many ways your church family already joins forces with other people of faith, AND ways you may want to do this in the future. We are learning that Together, it's more fun and less work. Together, we strengthen our faith. Together, we can do more.

They are starting their planning for their Halloween candy handout night and of course their Lutefisk Dinner along with helping with the Community Christmas Party.

Peace in Poplar just finished participating in the Poplar Fun Days where they had a float in the parade. They had a pancake breakfast with proceeds going to their Fire Department. They are preparing for their Harvest Dinner on Sept 27 and Women's Fall Bazaar on November 11.

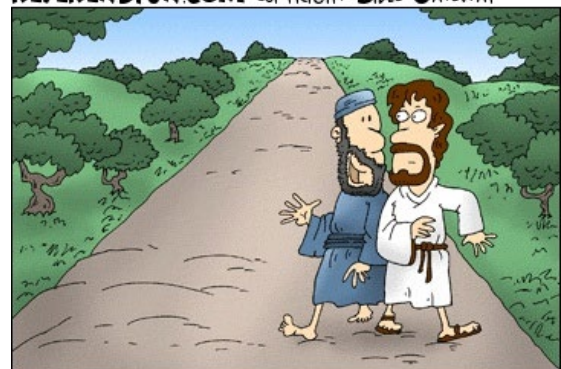

The following chicken salad recipe was served by the women of Redeemer Lutheran church at Burkhardt at the St. Croix Conference Fall Retreat and was quite popular. Handwritten notes have been added. (They made three batches, accompanied by small croissants and fruit.)

Chicken Rosamarina Salad

Serves 25

1 lb. Rosamarina Rice, cooked 10 minutes (Note: cooked Orzo pasta was used instead of rice. This is a rice-shaped pasta usually available in the grocery store.)

6 cups cubed turkey or chicken. (Note: Rotisserie chicken from the store was used. 1 to 1-1/2 chickens used for one recipe)

7 hard boiled eggs, chopped small

4 cups diced celery (1-1 lb bunch. We used 2 cups)

1/2 to 3/4 c. finely chopped green pepper

1/2 small onion, chopped fine

(Editor's note: finely diced cucumber could replace either the celery or onion)

1 jar pimento (optional for color -- they used red pepper instead)

1 quart (scant) Hellmann's Mayonnaise (3 pints)

3/4 tsp salt

2 Tbsps sugar (necessary for flavor)

1/4 c. lemon juice

Pinch of Garlic salt

Mix together. Chill and serve.

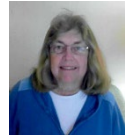
